Supreme Corporation's DBE Annual Overall Percentage Goal for 2015-2016 (Federal Fiscal Year 2016)

The U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), through the Federal Transit Administration and the Office of Civil Rights, manages the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program. The aim of the DBE program is to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of federally funded assisted contracts. Each DOT-assisted state and local transportation agency is required to establish DBE goals; this includes Transit Vehicle Manufacturers (TVMs). The DOT-assisted agencies establish contract specific DBE goals, where these goals are needed to ensure nondiscrimination in federally-assisted procurements.

Bus manufacturers must be certified by the U.S. Department of Transportation as a Transit Vehicle Manufacturer (TVM) in the DBE program to be eligible to bid on federally funded transit agency contracts. The DOT Federal Transit Administration maintains a listing of TVMs eligible to bid on federally funded transit agency contracts; Supreme Corporation is on the list.

Supreme Corporation, in meeting the requirements from the Code of Federal Regulations, 49 CFR 26.49, publicizes that Supreme Corporation's annual DBE goal for Federal Fiscal Year 2016 is .016%.
